

Your **TWINRIX** Vaccination Record.



Use this form to record the TWINRIX vaccine doses you have received and to remember future doses.

Ask your healthcare provider to complete this chart each time a vaccine dose is administered. Keep this information in a safe place with other important health records.

For long-term protection against hepatitis A and B, you must get all your scheduled TWINRIX doses.

Be sure to complete the vaccination series prescribed for you. Otherwise, you may not be full protected against hepatitis A and B.

If you miss a dose, call your healthcare provider to reschedule another visit.

Immunization may not be suitable for everyone and can be associated with adverse events. Be sure to consult your healthcare provider to see which options are right for you. 100% protection cannot be guaranteed and additional doses may be required.

TWINRIX is a vaccine used in adults, adolescents, children and infants to prevent hepatitis A and B diseases. 100% protection cannot be guaranteed and additional doses may be required. Very common adverse events (>10% of doses) reported in adults were pain or discomfort, redness at the injection site, headache, and tiredness. Common adverse events (1% to 10% of doses) were swelling at the injection site, diarrhea, nausea and vomiting, and generally feeling unwell. Very common adverse events (>10% of doses) reported in children were pain and redness at the injection site. Common adverse events (1% to 10% of doses) were swelling at the injection site, fatigue, fever (more than 37.5°C), irritability, drowsiness, headache, loss of appetite, diarrhea, nausea and vomiting, and generally feeling unwell. Allergic reactions may also occur. Vaccination may not be suitable for everyone, so ask your healthcare provider if TWINRIX is right for you. Full product information can be found on Twinrix.ca.
